Agenda No. 2:Implementation of NEP, 2020 from the academic session 2023 – 24.

The Chairman informed that an NEP implementation committee has already been formed with Dr.Mousumi Borah, Dean (Academics) as the convener. The college shall implement NEP, 2020 from the academic session 2023 – 24 vide Governing Body resolution no. 5 dated:10 – 12 – 2022. This resolution has to be endorsed by the Academic Council. The chairman also said that a resolution has to be taken that course curriculum under FYUGP shall be implemented from the academic session 2023 – 24.He informed that the syllabi of FYUGP has to be finalised by 31.05.2023 as per Government notification.He also informed that dynamic QR code has been introduced in the grade sheets of examinations under Autonomous status. The member secretary also presented the different steps taken up by the college towards implementation of various criteria under NEP, 2020.

The members appreciated the various steps taken by the college in the process of implementation of NEP, 2020 and adopted the following resolutions:

Resolution No. AC – 01/2023/02(a):Resolved to implement FYUGP and various features under NEP, 2020 from Academic Session 2023 – 24.

Resolution No. AC – 01/2023/02(b):It was resolved that the BoS of the departments will be held in such a manner that there is time to hold three such meetings (if necessary) before the end of May, 2023.

In this regard it was advised if possible the first BoS meeting may be held before the bihu and the second BoS meeting by the first week of May.

The course structure and the course codes were explained to the esteemed members. After thorough discussion, the members suggested that

- i. Change of minor subject may be allowed in the third semester and prerequisites for this purpose may be framed.
- ii. In case of value added course, two courses of 2 credits each may be offered to the students.
- iii. Dr.UtpalSarma suggested that course level may be reflected in the course codes.
- iv. It was suggested that a few courses under MDC/IDC course component may be developed to be offered to the students in the first two semesters.

The member secretary put forward the following subject pools that shall be offered under various course curriculum components :

Science:

(The students may choose any two subjects from any one of pools given below out of which one shall be core and the other shall be minor)

Physical Science: Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics.

Life Science: Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Anthropology.

Earth Science: Geology, Geography, Physics, Statistics.

Commerce:

(The students may choose any two subjects given below out of which one shall be core and the other shall be minor)

Management, Accountancy, Finance

Humanities/Social Science:

(The students may choose any two subjects from any one of pools given below out of which one shall be core and the other shall be minor)

Pool 1: Anthropology, Education, History, Assamese, Elective Bengali, Political Science

Pool 2: Economics, Mathematics, Statistics, Political Science, English, Bengali, Elective Hindi, Education

Pool 3: Geography, Philosophy, Sanskrit, Hindi, Elective Assamese, History, Economics, Statistics

OR

(The students shall choose one subject from each pool given below out of which one shall be core and the other shall be minor)

Pool 1: Anthropology, Economics, Geography, Philosophy, Political Science, Assamese, Elective Assamese, English

Pool 2: Education, History, Statistics, Mathematics, Sanskrit, Bengali, Hindi, Elective Hindi, Elective Bengali

Subject Pool for Skill Enhancement course:(The students shall choose one course for each semester)

Semester 1:

Tourism Anthropology – 1, Basic Analytical Chemistry – 1, Gardening, Environmental Geography, Environmental Geology, Computer Algebra – 1, Statistical Analysis using MS EXCEL, Basic Computer Knowledge, Apiculture, Translation (Hindi) – 1, Silpakala, Computational Economics, Public Speaking, Personality development, E-commerce, Historical tourism in North – East India, PandulipiPrastuti.

Semester 2:

Tourism Anthropology – 2, Floriculture and Interior Decoration with Indoor plants, Basic Analytical Chemistry – 2, Tourism Geography, Structural Geology, HTML, Statistical Analysis using SPSS, Programming skills with Python, Ornamental fish and fisheries, Translation (Hindi) – 2, AxomiyabhasharAkhorjutoni, Data Analysis, Argumentative

Philosophy, Entrepreneurship Plan and Development, Ancient Remains and Important tourist places of N-E India , Proof reading(Bangla)

Semester 3:

Public Health and Epidemiology, Bio-informatics, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Cartographic Technique, Basic Field Training, LATEX, R, Research and Technical Writing, Freshwater pearl culture, Social Media and Blog Writing, Research Methods in Social Science, Abbriti Kala, Management Philosophy, Computer Application in Business, Fairs and festivals of N – E India, Translation (Bangla), Extension activities

Subject Pool for Value Added Course/ Foundation Course:

Semester 1: Ancient Indian Studies, EVS.

Semester 2: Ancient Indian Studies, EVS.

The above subject pools were thoroughly studied by the expert members. They made some observations:

- i. The names of the subject pool for science stream may be renamed as Pool 1 (in place of Natural Science), Pool 2 (in place of Life Science) and Pool 3(in place of Earth Science)
- ii. As far as commerce is concerned the pool of subjects may remain the same.
- iii. In case of Humanities/Social Sciences two types of subject pools were shown. In the first type, the students may choose any two subjects from any one of pools given below out of which one shall be core and the other shall be minor. In the second type the students shall choose one subject from each pool given below out of which one shall be core and the other shall be minor. After much deliberation it was suggested to keep the first type of subject pool. The pre-requisites for lateral entry to the college was also shown. Dr.DipakSarma suggested that for lateral entry prerequisites for every curriculum may be framed and entrance test may be conducted.

Resolution No.AC – 01/2023/03(a): The Credit distribution matrix under FYUGP (single major) was accepted. The course code needs to reflect course level.

Resolution No. AC– 01/2023/03(b): The subject pools for science stream was approved with slight modification in the names of the pools. The subject pool of the commerce stream was also approved.For Arts stream, two options were given

and the first one was approved with 3 subject pools named as Pool I, Pool II and Pool III in order to maintain uniformity regarding subject selection with the other two streams.

Resolution No.AC – 01/2023/03(c): It was resolved that the college would offer MDC/IDC courses hence the departments shall develop a few of these courses.

Resolution No. AC – 01/2023/03(d): There was a consensus that the college would frame its own pre-requisites for lateral entry which would include entrance test.

The following future academic plans were laid down by the Principal which shall lead to the holistic growth of the college.

- a. The framing of the course curriculum shall be done in such a way that it enables the students to face any national level competitive examination.
- b. Discussion on syllabus under NEP.
 - i. 3rd and 4th year syllabi will be similar to that of major Indian Universities.
 - ii. Students shall go for field work only in the 6th semester.
- c. Opening of P.G courses in Anthropology, Assamese, Economics, Geology, History, Physics, Political Science, Zoology in a phase manner
- d. Approval of various add-on certificate courses
- e. Introduction of Honours course in Hindi
- f. Approval to open undergraduate course in Psychology and Sociology.
- g. Approval of BCA course under computer science department
- h. Approval of PGDCA course under computer science department
- i. Diploma Course in library and information science
- j. Guidelines for Ph. D guideship.
- k. Formation of integrated BoS for UG and PG courses under FYUGP.

There was a consensus among the members that while framing the syllabi under FYUGP the syllabi of national level competitive examination and that of major universities may be considered.
