15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

a) Delineate the vision/plan of the institution to transform itself into a holistic multidisciplinary institution.

The vision of the college is to establish some departments which would offer interdisciplinary courses. Moving forward on this path the college has already established Department of Disability Studies, Data Science, Sociology, Psychology and Computer Science. The college also plans to open the Department of Information and Library Science. The college intends to promote inclusivity in the framing of the course curriculum under NEP 2020 with the objective of imparting holistic education among students. At present the college already offers certificate courses in soft skill (Computer based courses) which is interdisciplinary in nature. The Department of History offers a multidisciplinary certificate course in Human Rights for all three streams of undergraduate students. Moreover, the college also has a biotech hub for undergraduate students of Chemistry, Botany and Zoology. Furthermore, the newly introduced Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Department of Disability Studies have already organised interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary certificate courses which is suggestive of the institution's preparedness for implementing NEP 2020, from the next academic session.

b) Delineate the Institutional approach towards the integration of humanities and science with STEM and provide the detail of programs with combinations.

The College has humanities and commerce streams together with science and mathematics (STEM). The college plans to integrate humanities, commerce and science by offering a barrier less subject pool (Eg: Management is offered in the subject pools of Arts and Science) under a new FYUGP syllabus framed as per NEP, 2020. Also there is no barrier in subject selection under the SEC course component. It is mandatory for students to choose IDC (Inter Disciplinary Course) subjects from streams other than the one they had pursued during their Higher Secondary. For instance, the student who comes from Higher Secondary (Science) background may choose any IDC course offered by Commerce or Arts Stream. This syllabus is proposed to be implemented from August, 2023. At present the College follows the Course Curriculum designed by Gauhati University and

under the prevailing CBCS Course Curriculum students are allowed to choose SEC (Skill Enhancement Course) across diverse disciplines.

c) Does the institution offer flexible and innovative curricula that includes credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, and value-based towards the attainment of a holistic and multidisciplinary education. Explain.

Although the College was granted autonomous status in May, 2022, in the academic session 2022-23 the College continued to follow the Gauhati University Course Curriculum with due permission from the University. The CBCS courses adopted are credit-based courses which include environmental education. Moreover, the College has already offered certificate courses in viz. i) Certificate Course in Human Rights (Dept. of History) ii) Certificate Course in Disability Studies and iii) Certificate Courses in Computer Applications. The College also has a North East Study Centre which promotes research on different aspects of the NE Region and as such is multidisciplinary in essence. At present the FYUGP course curriculum designed by the institution as per NEP 2020, has incorporated barrier less subject selection pool and credit-based courses and projects in the areas of environmental education, and value-based courses. For instance, Ancient Indian Studies is to be introduced as a compulsory value-added course from the next academic session and in the near future the College plans to introduce credit-based community engagement and service programmes.

d)What is the institutional plan for offering a multidisciplinary flexible curriculum that enables multiple entry and exits at the end of 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of undergraduate education while maintaining the rigor of learning? Explain with examples.

As per NEP, 2020 the credit distribution and the syllabus of the college has been framed in such a way that it enables multiple entry and exits at the end of 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of undergraduate education. For exit the student has to undertake an internship programme for which the college is in the process of making industry – academia linkage. In this regard, an MoU has already been signed with Trinity Fructa Pvt. Ltd. SRD Group, Industrial Area, Mangaldai, Assam. The newly designed course curriculum aims to ensure barrier less subject selection with regard to the Skill Enhancement Course (SEC). Furthermore, the IDC (Inter Disciplinary Course) offers a wide range of subjects which are interdisciplinary in nature. The College aims to implement the newly designed course curriculum from the next academic session.

e) What are the institutional plans to engage in more multidisciplinary research endeavours to find solutions to society's most pressing issues and challenges?

The College already has an Institutional Research Cell which facilitates a vibrant academic ambience in the college. The faculty members are encouraged to undertake research projects from various funding agencies like UGC, DST, CSIR, etc as well as for pursuing collaborative and interdisciplinary research with reputed institutions. They are encouraged to publish their research outcome in leading research journals. Conferences, seminars, workshops on frontier research topics and workshops pertaining to research methodology and IPR (Intellectual Property Rights) are organised at regular intervals for promoting research.

Research is also promoted at the department level through curriculum based research projects with fellow students and faculty members as mentors and supervisors. The College also has a North-East study centre which promotes research among students. Besides these, faculty members are provided seed funding as Institutional Research Grant (IRG) to pursue independent research in different dimensions of Humanities and Sciences with due emphasis on common scientific as well as social inquisitiveness. Till date research projects on the following topics have been completed by the following faculty members:

f) Describe any good practice/s of the institution to promote Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary approach in view of NEP 2020.

The College has organised multiple start-up programmes under the aegis of Institution's Innovation Council. The Department of History, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Disability Studies have organised certificate courses which are multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary in nature.

The College provides seed money under Institutional Research Grant to undertake research in various aspects of Humanities and Sciences. The College also has a North-East Study Centre which promotes interdisciplinary research among students.

Moreover, since the College was granted autonomous status by the UGC in May, 2022, the College has already framed the FYUGP course curriculum keeping in sight the core components of NEP 2020. The FYUGP course curriculum is to be introduced from the academic session 2023-24. The following are the distinctive features of the course curriculum:

- 1. Barrier less subject pool in minor subject
- 2. SEC subjects can be chosen from any discipline
- 3. IDC to be chosen from a stream not offered by students in HS.
- 4. Compulsory Value-added Course

These components of the FYUGP indicate the institutions dedication towards promoting interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary approaches.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

a) Describe the initiatives taken by the institution to fulfil the requirement of Academic bank of credits as proposed in NEP 2020.

The college has constituted the "Digital Learning Cell". The cell has three members including the convener. The convener of the "Digital Learning Cell" who is also the nodal officer of ABC, has already initiated and registered the college at ABC through NAD. The cell members along with the "Office of the Controller of Examinations" uploads the grade sheet (credits) of the students in the format of DGMST 2 template.

b) Whether the institution has registered under the ABC to permit its learners to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exit during the chosen programme? Provide details. The college has already registered at ABC through NAD. The NAD ID being 044818. The DGMST 2 is the template number of the grade sheet assigned to the college. Grades are uploaded in the format of DGMST 2 which can be accessed by the students through their ABC ID if they choose to exit from the college.

c) Describe the efforts of the institution for seamless collaboration, internationalization of education, joint degrees between Indian and foreign institutions, and to enable credit transfer.

The college has set up an "Internationalization Wing" to coordinate all matters relating to supporting students arriving from abroad. The Internationalization wing of Arya Vidyapeeth College (Autonomous) was constituted on 2/5/23 by the notification of the Principal of the Institution with Dr. Chhandashree Bhuyan, HoD Zoology as the Co-ordinator. The first program, a five weeks Capacity building with the first cohort of 25 students started on 5th September 2023 on online mode. The Resource person was Dr. Rita Kakati-Shah, a distinguished alumna of King's College London. The wing is on the process of executing an MoU with UMA in USA which is an international platform that partners with organizations to attract, retain and develop women and minorities in the workforce, through empowering confidence, inspiring success and building leadership and resilience.

d) How faculties are encouraged to design their own curricular and pedagogical approaches within the approved framework, including textbook, reading material selections, assignments, and assessments etc.

Besides teaching in accordance with the prescribed textbooks, the College also encourages faculty members to engage in curriculum-designing activities as well. Especially since the College has been engaged in deliberations over implementation of NEP, 2020, all Departments have been involved in the development of a revised curriculum for the same. Teachers are regularly engaged in framing new textbooks, course content, reading materials etc. To motivate the faculty in this pursuit, the College organizes a variety of training programs, seminars, conferences, FDPs, and other such capacity-building courses. For instance, a Workshop on IPR was conducted. A rigorous 3-day Workshop on Question Paper designing was held from 15 - 17th June, 2023 to train the faculty to design question papers in accordance with the revised Bloom's Taxonomy framework. Faculty members engage in publishing textbooks and other references for the aid of students. The College seeks to encourage

faculty in this pursuit by conducting official book launch events.

e) Describe any good practices of the institution pertaining to the implementation of Academic bank of credits (ABC) in the institution in view of NEP 2020.

In order to upgrade to the new requirements under NEP 2020, the College has already initiated the process of enrolling its students under the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) and necessary orientation of students has been carried out. Additionally, UGC approved tutorial videos on how to register at ABC are made available in the college website. To facilitate easy enrollment by students, the College website provides a tab for ABC account and digilocker. Although the College is committed to ensure universal enrollment under ABC, it has also made alternative provisions to accommodate those students without the necessary documents to create ABC account.

17.Skill development:

a) Describe the efforts made by the institution to strengthen the vocational education and soft skills of students in alignment with National Skills Qualifications Framework

The Department of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship has been established to strengthen vocational education and soft skills of students in alignment with the National Skills Qualifications Framework. The department provides adequate training in market relevant skills, creates awareness about employment opportunities and develops the spirit of entrepreneurship among the students.

b) Provide the details of the programmes offered to promote vocational education and its integration into mainstream education.

The College is dedicated to its mission of promoting vocational education and to materialise this objective the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship conducts relevant programmes with the aim of integrating vocational and mainstream education. The following programmes have been organized in the academic session 2022-23 to promote vocational education among the students.

A workshop on Design Thinking & Entrepreneurship 'Udaan-sensitising young minds for entrepreneurship' was organized in association with Lions Club on 19th September, 2022. The resource persons were Ms Sharmishtha N Paliwal, Co-Director, Third Eye Education Pvt. Ltd, Ms Drishti Medhi, Co-Founder, Quick Ghy.

A certificate course on "Basics of GIS & Remote Sensing and their Applications" involving an educative and evaluative component was organized in collaboration with Dept. of Geography from 25th February, 2023 to 5th April, 2023.

Five days Entrepreneurship Management Development Programme was organized from 1st March 2023 to 6th March 2023 with resource persons from diverse fields - Academicians, Bankers, Government Officials etc.

An Exhibition cum Sale of Art, Craft and Food Products prepared by the Self Help Groups was conducted on the 17th of March, 2023 where 86 students showcased different varieties of homemade products. Ms Bibhushita Sarma from Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE) delivered an encouraging speech on the occasion.

A one day workshop on Intellectual Property Rights and IP Management for Start-up was organized on the 10th of May 2023. The resource person, Dr. Ranjit kumar Barman, former Head, Science & Technology Division, ASTEC delivered an informative lecture on the technicalities of IPR.

The Institution's Innovation Cell organized a workshop on Business Model Canvas on the 16th of May, 2023. The concept of "Business Model Canvas" was explained by resource persons from diverse fields like banking, academics, entrepreneurs etc.

Moreover the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship frequently invites budding entrepreneurs to deliver lectures on a wide range of career prospects viz. food, sports etc. Awareness programmes on various aspects of entrepreneurship are also held on a regular basis. Students are also taken to visit different institutions offering skill courses like Incubation Centre in IIE, Guwahati to familiarize them with alternative career options.

c) How the institution is providing Value-based education to inculcate positivity amongst the learner that include the development of humanistic, ethical, Constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love(prem), nonviolence(ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and also life-skills etc.

The institution imparts value-based education through a variety of courses on Ancient Indian Studies, Yoga, Human Rights, Disability Studies besides the NCC and NSS programmes.

- d) Enlist the institution's efforts to:
- i. Design a credit structure to ensure that all students take at least one vocational course before graduating.

There are plans underway to introduce a compulsory 2 credit internship course in the 4th semester which shall be implemented from 2024-25 under National Educational Policy.

ii. Engaging the services of Industry veterans and Master Crafts persons to provide vocational skills and overcome gaps vis-à-vis trained faculty provisions.

Several initiatives have been undertaken to impart vocational education by the institution. The Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship initiated a lecture series with renowned entrepreneurs like celebrity chef and proprietor Heritage Khorika, Atul Lahkar (3rd September 2022), and Mr Darick Ranjan Deka, an established sports enthusiast (24th Feb 2023) for creating an enabling environment for the students. A workshop on Business Model Canvas was organised by the Institution's Innovation Council on the 16th of May, 2023.

iii. To offer vocational education in ODL/blended/on-campus modular modes to Learners.

Various departments of the college offer different certificate courses. The Computer Cell offers certificate courses like Computer fundamentals, Tally, Hardware and Networking, DTP, Software Professional, Computer Application and Diploma courses in Computer application and maintenance. The Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship offers courses from NEILIT, Basics of GIS and Remote Sensing and their applications etc.

iv. NSDC association to facilitate all this by creating a unified platform to manage learner enrolment (students and workers), skill mapping and certification.

Though presently the college has no association with NSDC but intends to collaborate with in the future to organize apprenticeship training programmes and courses.

v. Skilling courses are planned to be offered to students through online and/or distance mode.

There are plans to offer Skill based courses under NEP 2020 from the

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3rd semester onwards.

e) Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the Skill development in view of NEP 2020.

Notable events under good practises pertaining to Skill development include:

Conducting field visits to institutions like IIE etc, awareness programmes, workshops, seminars etc that help inculcate the spirit of entrepreneurship among students. The college provides students a platform to showcase and sell their handmade items by organizing exhibition cum sale.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

a) Delineate the strategy and details regarding the integration of the Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture etc,) into the curriculum using both offline and online courses.

The college has a Sanskrit department along with other Indian language departments like Assamese, Bengali and Hindi that promotes teaching in/of Indian language and literature. The medium of instruction followed in teaching other subjects is also not limited to English language but includes other mother tongue/local languages. Furthermore, in accordance with NEP, the college has planned to introduce Ancient Indian Studies as a compulsory valueadded course for degree students. The departments are also framing the new syllabus for the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme for implementation of NEP 2020 with an aim to integrate Indian knowledge system into the curriculum. As such, topics like Indian myths and folklores, ancient history, Vedic mathematics, astronomy etc. are being considered for incorporation in various degree courses. Also, the college plans to offer MOOCs to third semester students for IDC and SEC courses SAWAYAM-NPTEL. Furthermore, the college plans to conduct workshops for students, teachers as well as parents to create awareness and knowledge about the Indian Knowledge system.

b) What are the institutions plans to train its faculties to provide the classroom delivery in bilingual mode (English and vernacular)? Provide the details.

The college plans to initiate the installation of software like

Audacity, Prat and Flex in the computers of the Language Lab to promote the teaching of vernacular languages. Other than training in ICT tools, the college also plans to engage its teachers in training programme for classroom delivery and encourage them to participate in workshops on developing e-content in bilingual mode. Translation tools like ANUVADINI, an initiative of the Ministry of Education, will also be used to translate texts into vernacular languages so as to assist the faculty members to teach in languages other than English.

c) Provide the details of the degree courses taught in Indian languages and bilingually in the institution.

The college offers Bachelor Degree (Honors) in Assamese, Bengali and Sanskrit. Along with Assamese and Bengali, students can also opt for Hindi as their MIL/elective subject. All other degree courses in different subjects like Philosophy, Anthropology, Botany, History etc., except English, are taught bilingually to ensure effective teaching-learning.

- d) Describe the efforts of the institution to preserve and promote the following:
- i. Indian languages (Sanskrit, Pali, Prakrit and classical, tribal and endangered etc.):

The college has a Department of Sanskrit that offers Honors courses to the undergraduate students. With the aim of preserving and promoting Sanskrit language, the college has planned to introduce courses on Spoken Sanskrit. The Department of Sanskrit is also framing the syllabus to introduce Ancient Indian Studies as a compulsory value-added course for degree students. In cultural events, Sanskrit slokas are also recited by teachers and students to preserve the essence of Indian culture and tradition and also generate interest among the students towards Indian languages. The Department of Assamese has preserved two 15th century manuscripts made of 'Sansi paat' and wriiten in Assamese language which is also made available to the students. The college also encourages its teachers to compose written works in Indian languages. The Celebration and Cultural Committee of the college has also organized a "Book Launch Event" for one of its faculty members to promote publication of books in vernacular language. Furthermore, the department wall magazines of the language departments, except English, are also composed in their respective languages. It is an exercise done by the students, under the guidance of their teachers, which not only promotes multilinguism among the students but also

attempts to preserve the different Indian languages. The college anthem which is composed in the regional language is also an endeavor towards preserving and promotion of Indian languages.

ii. Indian ancient traditional knowledge:

To promote and preserve our ancient culture and heritage, the college has planned to introduce various topics bearing the essence of ancient Indian traditional knowledge in the syllabus of subjects like Vedic mathematics and astronomy of India, Vaastu and Shilpa Sashtra etc. The Ancient Indian Studies paper, to be offered by the Department of Sanskrit will include contents from classical Indian literature, Vedic literature etc. The Interdisciplinary Courses of various departments are also being prepared with an aim to introduce ancient traditional knowledge in its course structure.

iii. Indian Arts:

The College has been continuously promoting performing arts in general and indigenous art forms in particular. On International Mother Language Day, students and teachers collaborate to stage dramas in vernacular medium. On several other occasions, students are also encouraged to stage dramas in other Indian languages on themes relevant for the present generation. Competitions are also organized to promote and develop their acting skills. The college also recognizes the abilities of its students in the field of Indian arts like classical dance and song, chess and fine arts. As such students are encouraged to participate in various events and competitions to showcase their talent. Furthermore, the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship of the college has come up with a plan to introduce some of the traditional art forms of India. As such it plans to introduce certificate courses on some of the 64 traditional arts like the Chausath Kalas or Chathusashti Kalas, 'Geet Vidya' (art of singing), 'Vadya Vidya' (art of playing a musical instrument). 'Nritya Vidya' (art of dancing), 'Natya Vidya' (art of theatrical performance), 'Alekhya Vidya' (art of painting) etc.

iv. Indian Culture and traditions:

The college promotes the diverse cultures and traditions of India by celebrating festivals, organizing cultural events and processions, encouraging student's participation in various cultural events or competitions in/outside college. During the month of April, the college organizes Bihu to celebrate the beginning of new season. The college also celebrates Saraswati Puja where students and teachers

participate irrespective of their caste or creed. Additionally, the Department of Chemistry and Physics also celebrate Viswakarma Puja with equal participation of teachers and students. During the Annual College Week, students come in their traditional attires creating a spirit of multiculturalism. At several occasions, theme-based cultural performances and competitions are also organized to promote the cultural heritage of India. In order to orient students to their cultural roots, the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship of the college plans to introduce certificate courses on some of the 64 traditional arts known as the Chausath Kalas or Chathusashti Kalas. The department shall introduce 'Geet Vidya' (art of singing), 'Vadya Vidya' (art of playing a musical instrument). 'Nritya Vidya' (art of dancing), 'Natya Vidya' (art of theatrical performance), 'Alekhya Vidya' (art of painting) etc. in a phased manner.

e) Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course) in view of NEP 2020.

Except English, most of the subjects offered in the college are taught bilingually to promote effective teaching-learning.

Indian Knowledge system includes different branches of knowledge system like yoga, mathematics, astronomy, engineering, medical sciences, chess, fine arts and many more. The college has already planned to incorporate some of these knowledge systems in its course curriculum in a phased manner. However, at present the Yoga centre of the college, established in 2015, is functioning very actively. It organizes annual Yoga Day, International Yoga Day, Personality Development Program, etc. along with its regular practice sessions. Eminent scholars and masters of yogic science are invited as resource persons to speak on the significance of yoga in daily lives. The participants highly benefit from these events as they are also taught a few exercises along with the theoretical knowledge. The college also recognizes the abilities of its students in the field of chess and fine arts. As such they are encouraged to participate in various events and competitions to showcase their talent.

The college fosters cultural harmony and inclusivity by encouraging students and teachers to orient themselves with their native culture by staging classical, folk and traditional art forms. The college promotes Indian culture by celebrating a few indigenous festivals like Bihu, Saraswati Puja, Viswakarma Puja etc where students and teachers equally participate irrespective of their caste or creed.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

a) Describe the institutional initiatives to transform its curriculum towards Outcome based Education (OBE)?

Success in imparting meaningful education can ultimately be assessed by lookingat the outcomes of the educational process. Ever conscious of this, the College has striven to achieve the best possible outcomes by employing all resources available with it. The key educational outcomes that have been consistently pursued by the College include enhancement of student's knowledge base, developing their ability to acquire the requisite skills that can help them become employable in the near future besides imbibing desirable human values and traits that would contribute towards their holistic development.

The systematic approach adopted by the College in pursuit of these outcomes has involved the setting of clear objectives followed by their meticulous execution and evaluation. Prior to admission of the first batch under the new NEP-FYUGP since August, 2023, the College has been offering all its UG and PG Programmes according to the Gauhati University syllabus. The Gauhati University syllabus clearly stated the Course Outcomes. Thereafter, the College has been engaged in deliberations to develop a new framework for implementation of NEP, 2020. Under this initiative particular attention has been paid to ensure that the new course content is framed with an eye on learning outcomes. Hence, the implementation of NEP, 2020 constitutes a key step towards transform its curriculum towards Outcome based Education (OBE).

b) Explain the efforts made by the institution to capture the Outcome based education in teaching and learning practices.

Special instructions have been issued to the Departments to specify Learning Outcomes while framing the new syllabus, that is, to follow the Learning Outcome based Curricular Framework (LOCF). Accordingly, the new syllabus mentions the expected outcomes for every Course content. The College website displays the newly framed NEP syllabus where the focus on learning outcome specification is self evident. Graduate Attributes and Programme Outcomes are also available in the website.

Another crucial step in pursuing Outcome Based Education relates to making assessments of student's progress. The College has taken due care of this by putting in place a highly efficient evaluatory mechanism that combines continuous and cumulative assessment of

student's progress. It has been decided that the examination structure will al include Multiple Choice Based tests. The intent behind is to ease the process of quantification of student's results for their evaluation against measurable outcomes.

Not only are the student's progress evaluated while they're part of the institute, but their achievements and progression after passing out of the institute are also being tracked and recorded. This has helped the College secure a comprehensive picture of the outcomes of education that it has endevoured to impart.

c) Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the Outcome based education (OBE) in view of NEP 2020.

Given that the faculty must play a decisive role in executing our commitment to Outcome Based Education, the College has undertaken special initiatives to train them for the same. A Three-day workshop on question paper setting was conducted in the college from 15 th to 17 th of June, 2023 in order to train the faculty regarding the technicalities of framing question papers in accordance with the outcome oriented thrust of NEP. The application of revised-Bloom's taxonomy was a useful strategy taught during this workshop that the faculty have attempted to follow while setting questions.

20.Distance education/online education:

a) Delineate the possibilities of offering vocational courses through ODL mode in the institution.

The Open Distance Learning (ODL) has a very significant role in college as it provides schedule flexibility and accessibility along with the global knowledge-based society. College has two study centres (IGNOU and KKHSOU) under ODL which offer various vocational courses such as post graduate diploma in Analytical Chemistry, Certificate course in French language etc. Also, the College plans to prepare proper guidelines for the development and accreditation of Open and Distance Learning. The College targets not only to offer vocational courses but also to offer Bachelor Degree in Commerce and Arts, Master Degree in Arts courses in distance mode.

b) Describe about the development and use of technological tools for teaching learning activities. Provide the details about the institutional efforts towards the blended learning.

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The classes have been taken in blended mode which enables the scalability of the courses offered and also the students can achieve training globally. The College has Google meet app (paid version) through which virtual classroom and webinar can be arranged with national/international resource persons. Also, the College arranges workshops/seminars in blended mode to enhance students' practical skills and networking strategies in wide variety of topics. The College has Information and Communications Technology (ICT) classrooms which has improved considerably the quality of teaching-learning process. Moreover, to impart effective education and to facilitate upgradation of knowledge/skills, the faculty members regularly attend Faculty Development Programme (FDP), Induction/Orientation/Refresher courses in online mode.

c) Describe any good practices of the institution pertaining to the Distance education/online education in view of NEP 2020.

Regular awareness programmes have been arranged among the students and parents regarding the benefits of ODL. The College is already a NPTEL Local Chapter (College ID: 4346). The students can avail various certificate courses through NPTEL with definite credit which can be stored in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). The College already plans to implement one 3 credit course from the NPTEL platform for the students of 3rd semester onwards. The College has Study Centres of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) and Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) through which education in distance mode is provided to the students.

2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

The College prioritises quality education through continuous evaluation. The institution employs diverse methods such as class tests, assignments, group discussions, and seminars to assess students' learning levels. Students are divided into small groups and assigned mentors who cater to the specialized needs of both slow and advanced learners. Advanced learners are granted leadership roles and engaged in activities beyond the standard curriculum. They receive specialised/advanced learning materials and contribute by delivering course-related lectures (peerteaching) thereby fostering a dynamic educational environment. Recognizing the varying needs of students, remedial classes are organised for those requiring additional support, ensuring inclusive education.

All the departments maintain records of assignments, tutorials, tests, and remedial classes. Field trips and curriculum-aligned projects are organised to enhance practical understanding. Career-oriented programs organised by the institution cater to both advanced and slow learners, promoting holistic development.

Regular Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) keep parents informed about their wards' performance and attendance. Various clubs and cells, overseen by teachers, guide the students in extracurricular and cocurricular pursuits. The College's Career Counselling and Placement Cell aids students in understanding career prospects

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through talks, workshops, and recruitment drives.

Newly established Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship enriches students' employability with certificate courses and workshops. The College is committed to nurturing diverse talents, fostering a well-rounded educational experience.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences:

The college aims to foster all round development of the students and enhance their employability. As such, the college facilitates experiential and participative learning at different levels. At the departmental level field trips are organised and the students are required to submit projects as a part of the course curriculum. The faculty members involve the students in planning the field trips. Furthermore, students are divided into small groups and mentored by the faculty members of the department in writing assignments, projects and seminar papers.

Extension programmes like library and museum visits and academic activities like Popular Talks, Debates, Group Discussions and Quizzes are organised frequently and interaction with the resource person is facilitated. The students frequently visit academic institutes of national and international significance.

The faculty members of the College are adept in using ICT tools like computers, projectors, interactive smart boards and online teaching platforms. They effectively blend both the online/offline mode of teaching. The College has 19 ICT enabled classrooms and 2 ICT enabled conference rooms. The College has 24x7 internet facility with 100 MBPS bandwidth, which is used extensively by faculty members and students for effective teaching-learning. PowerPoint presentations and video lectures are integrated by the faculty members in the technology based teaching-learning process. Links of video lectures from YouTube and Swayam platform are provided to the students.

Teachers attend online MOOC courses under Swayam and various universities in India to enhance their teaching skills. Students are also encouraged to attend student specific MOOC courses of their choice. The College has been registered as a Swayam local chapter (LC Id. 4366). All the faculty members are allotted an institutional Email ID. Online classes are conducted through Google Meet and Google Classroom whenever required. In order to ease the process of information dissemination and to share resources, all the departments of the College have created Whatsapp groups for all the classes. Some faculty members of the college also disseminate learning material through YouTube.

The Research Cell guides and motivates teachers towards research. The Institutional Research Grant is provided to teachers to carry out research. The Institutional Bio-tech Hub trains students in bio-chemistry and bio-technology. The NSS unit of the College has adopted the slum areas within 3kms radius of the college and camps are organized in the slums on regular basis. The Community Development Cell in collaboration with Child Friendly Guwahati (a project under Snehalaya) works for the underprivileged students of the neighbourhood. The College promotes indigenous art and culture. Every year, the International Mother Language Day is celebrated where eminent scholars deliver talks and students stage plays in vernacular language. Institution's Innovation Council, established in April 2023, has organized workshops, talks, awareness programs on topics like IPR, self-confidence etc. They also organized a visit to IIE incubation center. The College has a multipurpose playground which is used by the students and neighbourhood for sports activities and cultural events. The College Archery Club affiliated to All Assam Archery Association carries out its regular practice sessions in the playground. The ground is also used by the neighbourhood to organise various cultural events like bihu, theatre etc.

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

The college has the following facilities:

- There are 73 classrooms, 19 ICT enabled classrooms and 2 ICT enabled Conference rooms.
- There are 23 laboratories in the science departments, two computer laboratories, a Bio-tech Hub and a Language Lab. Four laboratories of the college are recognised by Gauhati University as Ph.D Research Laboratories.
- The Computer Cell has 82 computers and it offers 9 different certificate and diploma courses. Departments have their individual computers.
- The college has 24x7 internet facility of 100 mbps speed.
- There are two hostels, one each for boys and girls.
- The college has Common Rooms for both boys and girls.
- The Central library equipped with KOHA software has a collection of more than fifty five thousand text and reference books.
- The auditorium has a seating capacity of around 500.
- The Department of Anthropology, Zoology and Geology have their individual museums to cater to their teacher-learning requirements.
- There is a power generator and rooftop solar power plates of 60 KWP.
- The Office of the Controller of Examination functions with an independent set up and has its own publishing mechanism.
- The college has a playground measuring 5.3 acre.

- (F) Conference Halls: The institution also has two conference halls -one fully air-conditioned conference hall with the capacity of about 50 participants and another with a capacity of 100 participants.

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Furthermore, the library offers digital access to selected collections, aiding students in their exam preparations. A thoughtful initiative, the Book Bank, supports economically challenged students by providing textbook borrowing options. The library is not merely a repository of conventional texts; it houses a distinctive collection of rare manuscripts and preserves contributions from retired faculty members.

The library facilitates enrolment with the National Library and Information Services Infrastructure (NLIST), offering students, research scholars, and faculty access to a vast array of scholarly content. Beyond being a repository, the library provides conducive reading spaces for students and allocates an exclusive area for faculty members. Additional amenities include Inter Library Loan services, reprographic facilities, and computer access with internet services. In essence, the college library stands as a comprehensive knowledge center, prioritizing accessibility, convenience, and scholarly engagement for the entire college community.

Faculties can access Wi fi and Lan based internet in their respective departments while students are given internet access through the Library and Computer Cell. The departments of Anthropology, Chemistry, and Statistics have separate computer laboratories to meet their requirements. The College uses licensed software, which include Microsoft Windows, SPSS, MATHEMATICA and KOHA. The department of Geography has an Arc GIS software. The earlier mode of physical admission has been shifted to online mode through customised Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software from the session 2019-20. The online students' feedback was initiated in the session 2019-20 through Google form. Moreover, online feedback was also collected from alumni and parents. The entire campus has been under the surveillance of high-resolution night vision CCTV cameras. The College has enhanced the internet bandwidth from 8 mbps in 2018 and to 100 mbps in 2023. The college has a social media handle to inform the public about the recent events and news. A biometric attendance system is in place for the staffs and faculties. The college had an allocated budget of 4 lakh for IT facilities for the session 2022-2023.

The Principal, the Governing Body, various statutory and non-statutory committees of the college work together in tandem and closely monitor the various academic and non-academic activities in the college. The college was granted autonomous status by the UGC in 2022 and thereafter three statutory bodies were formed: the Academic Council, BoS and Finance Committee. The Principal consults with the HoDs in all academic matters. The decisions taken in the HoDs meeting are communicated to the faculty members in the DAC meeting. Staff council meetings are held regularly and all important matters pertaining to the college are discussed.

The IQAC of the college plays a pivotal role in the policy framing of the college with regard to quality assurance and academic matters. It conducts regular meetings with the stakeholders.

The Office of the Controller of Examinations oversees all examination related matters. Further, the admission process is managed by an admission committee constituted with the teachers.

The College involves the teachers body (AVCTU), student body (AVCSU) and non-teaching association (AVCEA) in all important matters. The College also has a Students' Aid Fund to support underprivileged students. A Five Year Perspective Plan was prepared in the year 2018 to achieve goals related to academics, infrastructure and administrative reforms. Office of the Controller of Examination manages internal and semester examinations. Any grievances related to examinations are promptly redressed.

Several committees and cells are constituted by the Principal of the College with the faculty members and student representatives for overall management of the college.

The college participates in government initiatives like the Star College Scheme by DBT, receiving funds for academic and infrastructural enhancement. Additionally, the institution

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- successfully secures grants from various funding agencies, such as ICSSR, ICHR, NEC, MNRE, and ASTEC.
- Donations from Stakeholders: To augment its financial resources, the institution actively solicits donations in both cash and kind from alumni, individuals, and organizations. This not only fosters a sense of community support but also contributes to the institution's financial sustainability.
- Study Centres Collaboration: The institution generates revenue through collaborative efforts with study centres of prominent open universities like IGNOU and KKHSOU.
- Space Rental for Examinations: The institution optimizes resource utilization by renting out its spaces for various examinations.
- Interest Income from Investments: To maximize its financial assets, the institution invests a portion of its savings in fixed deposits. The interest accrued from these deposits constitutes a substantial portion of the institution's revenue, contributing to its overall financial health.

Four new departments were introduced in the academic year 2022-23, expanding academic offerings.

The IQAC initiated the formation of the Institution's Innovation Councilin accordance with the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell guidelines.

A three-day Capacity Building Workshop on Designing Question Papers was organized in collaboration with Azim Premji University, Bangalore.

The IQAC organized a one-day workshop on "Intellectual Property Rights and IP Management for Startups", enlightening faculty members on IPR aspects.

An awareness program on "cyber-crime" was conducted, educating all stakeholders about the potential threats in the cyber world.

These initiatives collectively reflect the IQAC's commitment to holistic quality enhancement across various aspects of the college's functioning.

The College is relentlessly in pursuit of bringing about positive changes to the society through various initiatives. The NSS unit has taken up a community service program in New Harijan Colony, Fatasil Ambari, Guwahati in association with various departments of the college. The Departments of Economics conducted various programs, where relevant issues like gender-sensitization and social harmony was highlighted, where they also donated dustbins in selected areas. The Bengali department arranged a street play creating awareness on art of living and also donated books on skill development. Various departments organize awareness programs on issues like child labour, child abuse, fundamental rights, health and hygiene, substance abuse, clean water for healthy life, waste management, environmental hazards, vaccination, nutrition, awareness on HIV/AIDS, government schemes, importance of child education and livelihood skills. The faculty members of the English department assists the Gorkha ME School in taking English classes as a part of community service. The college also provides these students the college auditorium for their cultural activities.

The College prioritises quality education through continuous evaluation. The institution employs diverse methods such as class tests, assignments, group discussions, and seminars to assess students' learning levels. Students are divided into small groups and assigned mentors who cater to the specialized needs of both slow and advanced learners. Advanced learners are

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granted leadership roles and engaged in activities beyond the standard curriculum. They receive specialised/advanced learning materials and contribute by delivering course-related lectures (peer-teaching) thereby fostering a dynamic educational environment. Recognizing the varying needs of students, remedial classes are organised for those requiring additional support, ensuring inclusive education.

All the departments maintain records of assignments, tutorials, tests, and remedial classes. Field trips and curriculum-aligned projects are organised to enhance practical understanding. Career-oriented programs organised by the institution cater to both advanced and slow learners, promoting holistic development.

Regular Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) keep parents informed about their wards' performance and attendance. Various clubs and cells, overseen by teachers, guide the students in extracurricular and co-curricular pursuits. The College's Career Counselling and Placement Cell aids students in understanding career prospects through talks, workshops, and recruitment drives.

Newly established Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship enriches students' employability with certificate courses and workshops. The College is committed to nurturing diverse talents, fostering a well-rounded educational experience.

2.3 - Teaching-Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences:

The college aims to foster all round development of the students and enhance their employability. As such, the college facilitates experiential and participative learning at different levels. At the departmental level field trips are organised and the students are required to submit projects as a part of the course curriculum. The faculty members involve the students in planning the field trips. Furthermore, students are divided into small groups and mentored by the faculty members of the department in writing assignments, projects and seminar papers.

The faculty members of the College are adept in using ICT tools like computers, projectors, interactive smart boards and online teaching platforms. They effectively blend both the online/offline mode of teaching. The College has 19 ICT enabled

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classrooms and 2 ICT enabled conference rooms. The College has 24x7 internet facility with 100 MBPS bandwidth, which is used extensively by faculty members and students for effective teaching-learning. PowerPoint presentations and video lectures are integrated by the faculty members in the technology based teaching-learning process. Links of video lectures from YouTube and Swayam platform are provided to the students.

Teachers attend online MOOC courses under Swayam and various universities in India to enhance their teaching skills. All the faculty members are allotted an institutional Email ID. Online classes are conducted through Google Meet and Google Classroom whenever required. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

The college has the following facilities:

- There are 73 classrooms, 19 ICT enabled classrooms and 2 ICT enabled Conference rooms.
- There are 23 laboratories in the science departments, two computer laboratories, a Bio-tech Hub and a Language Lab. Four laboratories of the college are recognised by Gauhati University as Ph.D Research Laboratories.
- The Computer Cell has 82 computers and it offers 9 different certificate and diploma courses. Departments have their individual computers.
- The college has 24x7 internet facility of 100 mbps speed.
- There are two hostels, one each for boys and girls.
- The college has Common Rooms for both boys and girls.
- The Central library equipped with KOHA software has a collection of more than fifty five thousand text and reference books.
- The auditorium has a seating capacity of around 500.
- The Department of Anthropology, Zoology and Geology have their individual museums to cater to their teacherlearning requirements.
- There is a power generator and rooftop solar power plates of 60 KWP.
- The Office of the Controller of Examination functions with an independent set up and has its own publishing mechanism.
- The college has a playground measuring 5.3 acre.

- (E) Auditorium for Cultural and Academic activities: The Guru Nanak Auditorium of Arya Vidyapeeth College serves as a multipurpose stage for organizing cultural, academic, physical and spiritual activities.
- (F) Conference Halls: The institution also has two conference halls -one fully air-conditioned conference hall with the capacity of about 50 participants and another with a capacity of 100 participants.
- (G) Boys Hostel Compound: The open space in front of the Boys Hostel Building is used by resident students for outdoor games and exercise.

Furthermore, the library offers digital access to selected collections, aiding students in their exam preparations. A thoughtful initiative, the Book Bank, supports economically challenged students by providing textbook borrowing options. The library is not merely a repository of conventional texts; it houses a distinctive collection of rare manuscripts and preserves contributions from retired faculty members.

The library facilitates enrolment with the National Library and Information Services Infrastructure (NLIST), offering students, research scholars, and faculty access to a vast array of

scholarly content. Beyond being a repository, the library provides conducive reading spaces for students and allocates an exclusive area for faculty members. Additional amenities include Inter Library Loan services, reprographic facilities, and computer access with internet services. In essence, the college library stands as a comprehensive knowledge center, prioritizing accessibility, convenience, and scholarly engagement for the entire college community.

The College has augmented its IT infrastructure in a phased manner. Faculties can access Wi fi and Lan based internet in their respective departments while students are given internet access through the Library and Computer Cell. The departments of Anthropology, Chemistry, and Statistics have separate computer laboratories to meet their requirements. The College uses licensed software, which include Microsoft Windows, SPSS, MATHEMATICA and KOHA. The department of Geography has an Arc GIS software. The earlier mode of physical admission has been shifted to online mode through customised Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software from the session 2019-20. The online students' feedback was initiated in the session 2019-20 through Google form. Moreover, online feedback was also collected from alumni and parents. The entire campus has been under the surveillance of high-resolution night vision CCTV cameras. The College has enhanced the internet bandwidth from 8 mbps in 2018 and to 100 mbps in 2023. The college has a social media handle to inform the public about the recent events and news. A biometric attendance system is in place for the staffs and faculties. The college had an allocated budget of 4 lakh for IT facilities for the session 2022-2023.

The books are arranged subject wise and proper registration of all books are done which can be accessed through 'KOHA open-source software'. The members of the Society can avail loan up to Rs. 9, 50,000.00 at the interest rate of 6% only. Moreover, the society offers a minimum 4% dividend to all the members annually.

Under the Autonomous status of the college, a finance committee (statutory body) has been set up for smooth functioning of the college's financial matters.

The college administration has an effective mechanism for maintaining records of all the incomes, grants and expenditures received from different sources. The records of the expenditures made out of the funds for the development of college are made along with supporting documents and receipts. The chartered accountant appointed by the college authority examines and verifies all documents related to income and expenditures on annual basis. This report is placed in the finance committee.

Financial audit at the college is done at two different levels: Internal Audit and External Audit.

The internal audit report is prepared by the chartered accountant which is then duly signed by the principal of the finance committee and placed before the Governing Body of the college for approval.

The relevant and necessary documents for external audit is produced by the college administration for proper verification to the auditor appointed by the Government of Assam who put together the final report.

- Government Fund Allocation: The institution secures funds from governmental bodies such as UGC, RUSA, and DST for both academic and infrastructural development. The college participates in government initiatives like the Star College Scheme by DBT, receiving funds for academic and infrastructural enhancement. Additionally, the institution successfully secures grants from various funding agencies, such as ICSSR, ICHR, NEC, MNRE, and ASTEC.
- Donations from Stakeholders: To augment its financial resources, the institution actively solicits donations in both cash and kind from alumni, individuals, and organizations. This not only fosters a sense of community support but also contributes to the institution's financial sustainability.
- Study Centres Collaboration: The institution generates revenue through collaborative efforts with study centres of prominent open universities like IGNOU and KKHSOU.
- Space Rental for Examinations: The institution optimizes resource utilization by renting out its spaces for various examinations.
- Interest Income from Investments: To maximize its financial assets, the institution invests a portion of its savings in fixed deposits. The interest accrued from these deposits constitutes a substantial portion of the institution's revenue, contributing to its overall financial health.

To foster a research-friendly environment, the IQAC advocated for and established the Institutional Research Grant, resulting in nine completed faculty research projects.

The IQAC transitioned feedback mechanisms from offline to online mode for students, teachers, employers, alumni, and parents.

Four new departments were introduced in the academic year 2022-23, expanding academic offerings.

The IQAC initiated the formation of the Institution's Innovation Councilin accordance with the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell guidelines.

A three-day Capacity Building Workshop on Designing Question Papers was organized in collaboration with Azim Premji University, Bangalore.

The IQAC organized a one-day workshop on "Intellectual Property Rights and IP Management for Startups", enlightening faculty members on IPR aspects.

An awareness program on "cyber-crime" was conducted, educating all stakeholders about the potential threats in the cyber world.

These initiatives collectively reflect the IQAC's commitment to holistic quality enhancement across various aspects of the college's functioning.

To achieve this goal a three-day "capacity building workshop on designing question paper" was organised by the Office of the Controller of Examinations, Arya Vidyapeeth College (Autonomous) in collaboration with Internal Quality Assessment Cell (IQAC) of the College. The workshop was held at the College premises from 15th to 17th June, 2023 with technical support from Azim Premji University, Bengaluru. The institution intends to frequently review course curriculum as well as question paper designing methodologies as per the guidelines of NEP 2020.

Moreover, continuous assessment is carried out at the departmental level through class tests, seminars, group discussions etc. which further helps in identifying the advanced learners and slow learners.

Although there is no specific E-waste management in the campus, bute-waste collection drivewas carried out by the Eco Club where the Vice President of Lions Club Leo, Daljit Singh delivered a lecture regarding awareness of the necessity of e-waste management. The chemical waste resulting from the chemistry department is treated in a soak peat. The treatment facility is under the ground of the laboratories. The solid waste like wood, wires, metals etc. from the physics department are regularly sent for recycling.
