### Computation of SGPA and CGPA

**SGPA** (S<sub>i</sub>) = 
$$\Sigma$$
(C<sub>i</sub> x G<sub>i</sub>) /  $\Sigma$ C<sub>i</sub>

where  $C_i$  is the number of credits of the  $i^{th}$  course and  $G_i$  is the grade point scored by the student in the  $i^{th}$  course.

**CGPA** = 
$$\Sigma$$
(Ci x Si) /  $\Sigma$  Ci

where S<sub>i</sub> is the SGPA of the i<sup>th</sup> semester and C<sub>i</sub> is the total number of credits in that semester

### MINIMUM FOR A PASS

No candidate shall be declared to have passed the Semester Examination as the case may be under each course/paper unless he/she obtains not less than 40% of the total marks in formative and summative assessment taken together with corresponding letter grade P and CGPA 4.0 in aggregate.
